She said they would go through each of the bands with a short comment on each.

Band 1 Had a very very good start; faults were mostly from quick or slow blows

Band 2 Practice ringing was quick; the test piece was a good steady ring although this lapsed towards the end. Faults were picked up from quick blows.

Band 3 The ringing was a little bit brisk and faults were mostly accrued at hand stroke

Band 4 Rang over 240 rows, the practice was unsteady but improved in the test piece, faults were gained at hand stroke and they felt that more attention needed with the hand stroke gap.

Band 5. Most faults were made at hand stroke, small faults were picked up throughout the changes

The results were read out in reverse order

5th Standon with 38%

4th Bishops Stortford with 51%

3rd Redbourn with 66%

2nd Hemel Hempstead with 69%

1st Tewin with 75%

And so Tewin were presented with the Kimpton Cup
